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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear PaPS members,

I wish every one of you a happy New Year! The change in the year is the perfect time to reflect on what we have accomplished and to have a new perspective towards the new year. While the COVID-19 crisis continues to wreak havoc on our lives, the need for accessible and equitable mental health supports has never been greater. Social isolation and economic impacts, the important social determinants of mental health, may exacerbate or trigger new incidences of psychiatric disability. A national shortage of mental health providers and other coverage challenges will make it difficult for people with mental illness to access care. These pandemic years have provided an opportunity for us to move forward in new ways and to grow and adapt.

On the societal level, we have faced the challenges and sought ways to manage them to pursue our mission. For some time, we have been looking at ways to engage members while addressing budget concerns. After careful discussion with the Board and the Long-Range Planning Committee, it was decided to move forward with a new association management service, starting January 1, 2022. It is with great pleasure that I introduce to you our new management team, Next Wave Group (NWG). With more than 20 years of experience in managing medical associations in various states, the team brings unique expertise and skills to the table. We look forward to increased flexibility in working with the NWG in furthering our mission.

The Pennsylvania Psychiatric Society (PaPS) founded in 1939 by William Charles Sandy, MD, as a district branch of the American Psychiatric Association. PaPS proudly draws members involved in various psychiatric practices, research, the public sector, the military, and academia while subsequently representing the diverse patients for whom they care. The mission of PaPS is to provide advocacy for psychiatrists and their patients, and to assure access to high quality psychiatric services through education, the shaping of legislation, and the upholding of ethical standards.

Throughout 2021, the PaPS has remained active during a COVID-19 pandemic that has enabled us to meet our goals, help our members network and stay abreast of current advocacy and practice issues. I am humbled to report our association's outstanding work thus far.

Highlights of member service include:

- The Philadelphia Psychiatric Society (the biggest chapter within our district branch) held a Philadelphia Colloquium of Scholars as a virtual meeting on April 10th. Topics addressed by experts in the field of mood disorders, sleep disorders, psychodynamic practice, and the integration of physical and psychiatric care. The 7th annual Addictions symposium was held on September 18th, offered a primer course addressing varied topics in addiction medicine and the annual Women's Brunch, held in May 22nd addressing Climate Crisis and Mental Health, Mental Health Benefits of Nature & Nature-Based Interventions and Climate Justice and Mental Health. A resident networking event was held the on October at a local orchard, was well attended.
- The Pittsburgh Psychiatric Society held their virtual symposium on March 13th on topics related to Physician Burnout, Private practice, Atypical Antipsychotics forms and profiles and Brain behavior correlated in Dementia. They held their annual residents/awards evening on November 8, 2021: The Pittsburgh Chapter presented the Lifetime Achievement Award to Melvin P. Melnick, MD, DLFAPA. As this was the first face-to-face event of the chapter in almost two years, the program was well attended.
- Small Chapter Coalition (Central, Lehigh, Northwestern and Western), conducted a virtual webinar on April 22, 2021, and October 27, 2021. Subsequently covered topics are on Psychological Aspects of

Survivorship and Resilience and Risk Management and Legal Basics. The Central Chapter with the Lehigh Valley Chapter co-hosted a virtual event on August 19, 2021. Residents presented posters and the awards were handed out. For the second year in a row Lehigh Valley Chapter held a virtual Summer Advocacy event for their two psychiatric residency programs on July 18th.

 Our District Branch successfully hosted Patient Safety & Risk Management on November 13th. Speakers presented topics on Clinically significant Drug Interactions, Reducing the risk on psychiatric Practice Litigation, and weighing the benefits/risks of using Ketamine and Esketamine and Risk Management in Telepsychiatry. At the State Education Meeting, we honored the winner of the PAPS Presidential Award, George Wohlreich, MD.

Our society advocates on behalf of our membership and our patients through our participation in the APA Assembly and other regional initiatives. As a society, we regularly adjust our advocacy strategy at the grassroots level, in response to the changing political landscape and the COVID-19 outbreak. Our legislative activities and advocacy work as detailed in the lobbyist report, a few highlights of the advocacy work include:

 Scope of practice efforts including opposing psychological prescribing efforts, Collaborative Care (CoCM) legislation in Pennsylvania, gun control/gun violence initiatives, reviewing recently introduced proposed cannabis legalization, monitoring cost containment initiatives related to pharmaceuticals and tracking scope of practice expansion initiatives. PaPS appointed a working group on the legalization of marijuana and supervised injection sites and presented a position paper outlining safety and health concerns. The working group continues to discuss safe injections and safe observation sites. We collaborate with the Pennsylvania Psychiatric Leadership Council as part of our efforts to provide equitable care and a host of other discussions on structural and institutional racism.

I am truly grateful to the valuable membership and leadership of the Pennsylvania Psychiatric Society for their support and commitment to advancing the vision of our organization. Our committees and task force continues their work on a variety of matters related to the mission of our organization, including by-laws, clinical concerns, education, ethics, government relations, membership, and strategic objectives. We are continuing our efforts in addressing early career/future psychiatrists their unique needs, by fostering leadership and mentorship activities, providing exposure to legislative activities, and so forth, allowing them to network, connect, and learn from colleagues.

The Pennsylvania Medical Society has played an integral role over the past 50 years, and we look forward to working together on similar issues affecting the medical profession. I would like to thank the former management company "TEAM" for their support. I would like to especially thank, Jennifer Redmond, former executive director, for her excellent professionalism, Deborah Shoemaker, a former lobbyist, for her impassioned advocacy work, and Dawn Losiewicz, for her untiring efforts in support of the chapters. The PaPS flourished with the commitment and longstanding friends of the society. This was reflected in recent collaborations with Gwen and Dave Lehmans. I would like to express our gratitude, for having helped us with valuable thoughts when needed.

Individuals with mental health issues face many barriers to accessing quality and culturally affirmed care; the recent crisis has only exacerbated these inequities. Pandemics underscore the importance of transforming mental health care and the need to engage local, state and federal governments to address emerging challenges. PaPS continues to find ways to engage members, to foster learning among colleagues, to join forces to face urgently needed challenges in our field and inspire the next generation of psychiatrists. Collectively, we can make it better!

Some out-patient psychiatrists may need to provide their cash patients and those shopping for care with a specific "Good Faith Estimate" of charges. Some out-ofnetwork psychiatrists providing emergency care may be required to charge less than their usual fee. The APA summary is a good place to start learning about the new rules.
